**OFFICE MEMORANDUM**

**Sub: Amendment of Biju Gram Jyoti-Rural Electrification programme of the State Government.**

1. The State Government had introduced the scheme namely "Biju Gram Jyoti-Rural Electrification programme" during the year 2007-08 for electrification of villages/habitations having population below 100 which were not eligible to be covered under the Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY). It was decided that 10,000 villages/habitations would be covered during 11<sup>th</sup> Five year Plan. Accordingly, the Govt. had allocated an amount of Rs.314 Crore for the scheme @ Rs.50 Lakh per block per annum for 2007-08 and 2008-09. The detailed guidelines for execution of the scheme were issued vide this Department Office Memorandum No.8228 dt.26.09.07.
2. (a) In course of execution of the scheme, certain difficulties were brought to the notice of the Govt. Hence, revised guideline was issued vide this Dept. OM No. 837 dated.03.02.2010, modifying the maximum cost limit of electrification of Rs.3.50 Lakh per habitation to Rs.4.50 Lakh in plain areas and Rs.6.00 Lakh in the hilly and tribal area. Besides, it was stipulated that where energisation of private L.I Points/Pump sets is not feasible in a Block, the matter with all justification for diversion of funds shall be placed before the DEC by the Collectors and after approval of DEC, the Collectors will be competent to divert the funds from one activity to another.  
(b) As a result of implementation of electrification programme including Biju Gram Jyoti, Biju Saharanchal Vidyutkaran Yojana and Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutkaran Yojana the demand for drawl of power from transmission system has tremendously increased. This has subjected

distribution transformer and conductors to much high loads than their rated capacities resulting in burning of transformers and snapping of conductors, seriously affecting the power supply. Besides, the cost of village/habitation electrification in several inaccessible and tribal areas is found to be inadequate. Collectors are frequently requesting in such cases for raising the ceiling limit of expenditure per habitation and ceiling limit per Block to carry forward rural electrification works in those areas. In order to overcome such difficulties the guideline was again revised in this Department OM No. 3575 dated 30.04.2012 in incorporating the following amendment.

- (i) The ceiling limit of Rs.4.50 Lakh in plain areas and Rs. 6 Lakh in hilly areas is allowed to continue as a norm. However, energy Department may enhance the ceiling amount of expenditure per habitation in deserving cases with due recommendation of the District Electricity Committee.
- (ii) The provision in the guidelines at Para -3(i) of the office Memorandum No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2007 under no circumstances the expenditure under village/habitation electrification shall exceed the allocation of Rs. 37.50 Lakh per Block is deleted to facilitate provision of funds from time to time on availability of funds and field requirement.
- (iii) Whenever required, upgradation of power transformers in 33/11KV Substation and other system requirement shall be taken up with approval of Collector. The word in Para 3(ii) of the OM No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2007 "not covered by RGGVY "is deleted.
- (iv) Energization of LI Points/Pump sets component is excluded from the scope of BGJ programme.
- (v) One time exemption of ceiling limit of Rs.7.50 Lakh per Block for energization of LI Points/Pump sets is given to Balasore District.

(c) In order to incorporate necessary upgradation of system including capacity of distribution transformers, commissioning of Power Transformer with associated conductor at 33KV and 11 KV levels under Biju Gram Jyoti. The guidelines was again revised in this Department Office Memorandum No. 2806 dated 02.04.2013 with the following amendment.

Within current norm of Rs.50.00 Lakh per Block per annum, 50 % of fund is kept for electrification of village / habitation, 40% for system upgradation and 10% for BPL Household electrification. It would mean



Rs.25.00 Lakh will be spent for electrification of Habitation, Rs.20.00 Lakh for system improvement and Rs. 5.00 Lakh for BPL Households.

3. As per Para 3 (III) of the BGJ Guidelines the main objectives of the BGJY schemes is:
  - (i) Electrification of the un-electrified /de-electrified villages/habitations having population below 100.
  - (ii) Electricity connection to the un-electrified BPL Households on the pattern of "KUTIR JYOTI" in the villages/habitations electrified under BGJY within a maximum cost of Rs.2,000/- (Rupees two Thousand) only per household. This includes (a) service connection to the households upto 30 Mtrs. (b) A 5Amps Meter (c) Two CFL bulb(18W -1no. and 11W-1no.)
4. Ministry of Power ,Govt of India vide their office Memorandum No.44/10/2011-RE dated 29.08.2013 have increased the monetary limit of electricity connection to BPL HHs from Rs.2200/- to Rs.3,000/- under ongoing Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana(RGGVY) 12<sup>th</sup> Plan projects with provision of LED lamps in place of CFL bulbs. In the RGGVY 11<sup>th</sup> Plan Projects the unit cost for giving electricity connection to BPL HHs was Rs.2,200/-
5. For effective implementation of the scheme, Government, after careful consideration, have been pleased to amend the Para 3(iii) of the original guidelines as under.

Electrical connection to the un-electrified BPL households on the pattern of "KUTIR JYOTI" in the habitations/villages electrified under the BGJ within a maximum cost of Rs.3,000/- (Rupees Three Thousand ) only per households. This component will include (a) service connection to the households upto 30Mtrs (b) A 5 Amps Meter (c) Two LED Lamps.
6. This has been concurred in by Finance Dept. Vide UOR No.109 WF II dated 06.08.2015.

All other terms and conditions laid down in the Office Memorandum No.8228 dt.26.09.2007, No.837 dt.03.02.2010, No.3575 dt.30.04.2012 and No.2806 dt.02.04.2013 shall remain unchanged.

Sub:- Biju Gram Jyoti Rural Electrification programme of the State Govt.- Amendment of the guideline issued vide OM No.8228 dt.26.09.2007, OM No.837 dt.03.02.2010 and OM No.3575 dt.30.04.2012.

The State Govt. had introduced the scheme, namely "Biju Gram Jyoti- Rural Electrification programme" during the year 2007-08 for electrification of villages/habitations having population below 100 which were not eligible to be covered under Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana. The detailed guideline for execution of the scheme was issued vide this Department OM No.8228 dt. 26.09.2007. In course of execution of scheme certain difficulties were brought to the notice of the Government. Hence a revised guideline was issued in the Department O.M. No. 837 dt. 03.02.2010 modifying the maximum cost limit of electrification of Rs. 3.50 lakh per habitation to Rs. 4.50 lakh in plain areas and Rs. 6.00 lakh in the hilly and tribal areas. Besides, it was stipulated that where energisation of private L.I Points/ Pump sets is not feasible in a Block, the matter with all justification for diversion of funds shall be placed before the DEC by the Collectors and after approval of DEC, the Collectors will be competent to divert the funds from one activity to another.

- (a) As a result of implementation of electrification programme including Biju Gram Jyoti, Biju Saharanchal Vidyutikaran Yojana and Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana the demand for drawal of power from transmission system has tremendously increased. This has subjected distribution transformer and conductors to much high loads than their rated capacities resulting in burning of transformers and snapping of conductors, seriously affecting the power supply. Besides the cost of village/ habitation electrification in several inaccessible and tribal areas is found to be inadequate. Collectors are frequently requesting in such cases for raising the ceiling limit of expenditure per habitation and ceiling limit per Block to carry forward rural electrification works in those areas. In order to over come such difficulties the guideline was again revised



in this Department OM No. 3575 dated 30.04.2012 incorporating the following amendment.

- (i) The ceiling limit of Rs. 4.50 lakh in plain areas and Rs. 6.00 lakh in hilly areas is allowed to continue as a norm. However, Energy Department may enhance the ceiling amount of expenditure per habitation in deserving cases with due recommendation of the District Electricity Committee.
- (ii) The provision in the guidelines at Para-3(i) of the office Memorandum No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2007 under no circumstances the expenditure under village/ habitation electrification shall exceed the allocation of Rs. 37.50 lakh per Block is deleted to facilitate provision of funds from time to time on availability of funds and field requirement.
- (iii) Wherever required, up-gradation of power transformer in 33/11 KV Sub-Station and other system requirement shall be taken up with approval of Collector. The word in para 3(ii) of the OM No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2002 "not covered by RGGVY" is deleted.
- (iv) Energisation of L.I Points/ Pumpsets component is excluded from the scope of BGJ Programme.
- (v) One time exemption of ceiling limit of Rs. 7.50 lakh per Block for energisation of L.I Points/ Pumpsets is given to Balasore district.

Now, it is necessary to incorporate necessary up-gradation of system including capacity of distribution transformers, commissioning of power transformer with associated conductors at 33 KV and 11 KV levels under Biju Gram Jyoti within current norm of Rs. 50.00 lakh per Block per annum. 50% of the fund is kept for electrification of village/habitation, 40% for system up-gradation and 10% for BPL household electrification. It would mean Rs. 25.00 lakh will be spent for electrification of habitation, Rs. 20.00 lakh for system improvement and Rs. 5.00 lakh for BPL households.

All other terms and conditions laid down in the office memorandum No. 8228 dt. 26.07.2007, No. 847 dt. 03.02.2010, and No. 3575 dt. 30.04.2012 shall remain unchanged.

Subj: Biju Gram Jyoti Rural Electrification programme of the State Govt.- Amendment of the guideline issued vide OM No.8228 dt.26.09.2007 and OM No.837 dt.03.02.2010.

- (a) As a result of implementation of electrification programme including Biju Gram Jyoti, Biju Saharanchal Viduyutikaran Yojana and Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Viduyutikaran Yojana the demand for drawal of power from transmission system has tremendously increased. This has subjected distribution transformer and conductors to much high loads than their rated capacities resulting in burning of transformers and snapping of conductors, seriously affecting the power supply. Besides the cost of village/ habitation electrification in several inaccessible and tribal areas is found to be inadequate. Collectors are



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frequently requesting in such cases for raising the ceiling limit of expenditure per habitation and ceiling limit per Block to carry forward rural electrification works in those areas.

(b) The ceiling limit of Rs. 37.50 lakh per Block was specified where the allocation during the initial two years of implementations i.e during 2007-08 & 2008-09 were Rs. 50.00 lakh per Block. The habitations level survey in all the districts have been done in the meanwhile to identify the habitations with less than population of 100 which are not electrified. The numbers of un-electrified habitations having less than 100 population vary from Block to Block and District to District.

(c) In some Blocks the amount allotted for energisation of L.I Points/ Pump sets is not being utilized as L.I, Points are not feasible in some blocks. Besides schemes of similar nature are being implemented by Water Resources Department. Energisation of L.I. Point/ Pump sets by the Energy Department may result in duplication of effort on the part of the Government.

(d) In Balasore district due to high demand for energisation of L.I Points, the district administration has collected farmers' contribution towards energisation of private L.I Point/ Pump sets which exceeded the ceiling limit of Rs. 7.50 lakh per Block/ Year.

Since these difficulties were delaying the implementation of the scheme, Government after careful consideration of the said difficulties have been pleased to amend the guidelines as under to facilitate effective implementation of the rural electrification programme.

(i) The ceiling of Rs. 4.50 lakh in plain areas and Rs. 6.00 Lakh in hilly areas is allowed to continue as a norm. **However Energy Department may enhance the ceiling amount of expenditure per habitation in deserving cases with due recommendation of the District Electricity Committee.**

(ii) The provision in the guidelines at para-3(i) of the Office memorandum No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2007 "**under no circumstances the expenditure under village/ habitation electrification shall exceed the allocation of Rs. 37.50 lakh per Block is deleted** to facilitate provision of funds from



time to time based on availability of funds and field requirement.

- (iii) Wherever required, upgradation of power transformer in 33/11 KV Sub-Station and other system improvement shall be taken up with the approval of Collector. **The word in para 3(ii) of the O.M No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2007 "not covered by the RGGVY" is deleted.**
- (iv) **Energisation of L.I Points/ Pump sets component is excluded from the scope of the BGJ Programme.**
- (v) **One time exemption of ceiling limit of Rs. 7.50 lakh per Block for energisation L.I Point/ Pump sets is given to Balasore district.**

All other terms and conditions laid down in the office memorandum No. 8228 dt. 26.09.2007 and O.M. No. 837 dt. 03.02.2010 shall remain unchanged.

This has been concurred in by Finance Department vide their U.O.R No. 141-W-ii dt. 23.02.2012 and vetted by P&C Department vide their UOI No. 1003/OSD RVS dt. 03.04.2012.

**Sub:- Biju Gram Jyoti- Rural Electrification programme of the State Government. Amendment of the guidelines issued vide OM No.8228 dt.26.09.07**

The State Government had introduced the scheme namely "Biju Gram Jyoti Rural-Electrification. Programme" during the year 2007-08 for electrification of villages/habitations having population below 100. It was decided that 10,000 villages/habitations will be covered during the 11<sup>th</sup> five year plan. Accordingly the Govt. have allocated an amount of Rs.314 crore for the scheme @ Rs.50 Lakh per Block per annum for 2007-08 and 2008-09. The detailed guidelines for execution of the scheme were issued vide this Department Office Memorandum No.8228 dt.26.09.07.

In course of execution of the scheme, the following functional difficulties/problems have been brought to the notice of the Government.

(a) The cost of electrification per habitation/village was exceeding Rs.3.50 lakh in a number of cases for which the Collectors could not take up such habitations/villages under the scheme even though these habitations/villages are otherwise suitable for coverage. The cost was exceeding the limit of Rs.3.50 Lakh due to the factors such as distance, right of way and difficult location.

(b) A sum of Rs.7.50 lakh per Block earmarked for energisation of private LI points/pump sets is lying unspent as energisation of private LI points/pump sets is not feasible.



Since these difficulties were delaying the implementation of the scheme, Government after careful consideration of the above difficulties, have been pleased to amend the original guidelines as under.

1. Para 3(1) of the Office Memorandum No. 8228 dt. 26.09.07 shall be partially modified in the manner indicated below:


"Electrification of un-electrified / de-electrified habitations/villages (wherever electrification is feasible through Grid Connectivity i.e. conventional electricity) having population below 100 as per the 2001 census can be made with a maximum cost of 4.5 Lakh in plain areas and Rs.6.00 Lakh in hilly and tribal areas per habitation/ village (to be limited to actuals). Under no circumstances, the expenditure under village/habitation electrification shall exceed the total allocation of Rs.37.50 Lakh."

2. Where energisation of private LI points/pump sets is not feasible in a Block, the matter with all justification for diversion of funds shall be placed before the DEC by the Collectors and after approval by the DEC, the Collectors will be competent to divert the funds from one activity to another.

3. An amount of Rs.5,800/- per habitation will be spent to fix a signboard displaying that the habitation has been electrified under Biju Gram Jyoti during the relevant year of completion. This amount will be met out of the component meant for village electrification.

All other terms and conditions laid down in the office memorandum No.8228 dt.26.09.2007 shall remain unchanged.

This has been concurred in by the Finance Department vide their UOR No.11-W-II dated 16.01.2010.

Sub: **Biju Gram Jyoti – Rural Electrification Programme of the State Government**

The State Government have decided to formulate a Scheme for electrification of villages /habitations which are not scheduled to be covered under the Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY). The Rural Electrification Corporation vide their letter No. REC/BH/RGGVY/E-250(A)/703(4) dated 16.01.2006 intimated that the Ministry of Power, Government of India have decided that only those habitations having population of 300 and above are to be covered under the Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY). Such stipulation will result in exclusion of a large number of habitations/ villages of the State. Subsequently, the Rural Electrification Corporation Ltd. Vide their letter dated 27.07.2007 informed that "the issue of covering habitations having population less than 300 was discussed in the Monitoring Committee Meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2007 under the Chairmanship of Secretary(Power). It was decided that all habitations having population of more than 100 shall be included for implementation under Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana(RGGVY)".

I am directed to convey the approval of Government for the "Biju Gram Jyoti – Rural Electrification Programme of the State Government" for attainment of the goal of providing access to electricity to all habitations during the next five years.



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2. Altogether 10,000 habitations /villages will be covered during the 11<sup>th</sup> five year plan period. In the first phase, the Government has proposed to allocate an amount of Rs. 315 crore for the Scheme. Taking Block as the unit for allocation of funds, an amount of Rs. 1 crore is proposed to be allocated per block i.e. @ Rs.50 lakhs for the current year 2007-08 and Rs.50 lakhs per block for the year 2008-09. Accordingly, Collectors should prepare the 'plan of action' for the different components of Biju Gram Jyoti for two years i.e. 2007-08 & 2008-09.

3. Scope of the Scheme

Under the BGJ, the following items of work will be taken up for execution :

- (I) Electrification of unelectrified / de-electrified habitations/villages (wherever electrification is feasible through Grid connectivity i.e. Conventional Electricity) having population below 100 as per the 2001 census within a maximum cost of Rs.3.5 lakh per habitation/ village (to be limited to actuals). A village will be treated electrified, if it meets the 'new definition' of an 'electrified village' as explained in the Annexure-II. Electrification of habitations will be done preferably by following the cluster approach. That means habitations in cluster will get priority in electrification over those which are scattered.
- (II) Up-gradation of capacity of the distribution system in order to cope with additional load within a maximum cost of Rs. 1.5 lakh per village/habitation, which may include:
- Up-gradation of the existing Distribution Transformer of appropriate capacity in electrified habitations/villages.
  - Re-conductoring of 11 KV conductor.
  - Provision of LT/Jess transformer at village / habitations to be covered under BGJ.
  - Provision of DT metering for energy audit.
  - Provision of XLPE AB cables for L.T. Line.



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Wherever required and not covered by the RGGVY, up gradation of power transformer of 33/11KV sub-station and other systems improvement shall be taken up with the approval of collector.

- (iii) Electrical connection to the un-electrified BPL households on the pattern of 'Kutir Jyoti' in the habitations/ villages electrified under the BGI within a maximum cost of Rs. 2,000 (Rupees Two Thousand) only per household. This component will include (a) service connection to the household upto 30 Mtrs., (b) a 5 Amps. MCB, and (c) ~~two~~ (two) CFL bulbs of capacity 18 Watt and 11 Watt respectively.
- (iv) The maximum estimated cost of different components per habitation and household are given in the Annexure-III, which will be limited to actual cost.
- (v) One percent of the funds allocated under the Scheme shall be available (0.50% to the State/ EIC level and 0.50% to Districts/ Blocks) for contingent expenses under the Scheme.

#### 4. Implementation Mechanism

- (i) Collector of the District will be the nodal agency for implementation of the Scheme. Accordingly, funds under the scheme are placed to the concerned Collector.
- (ii) Collector will call for tenders for execution of the Scheme on turn key basis by publication at least in two State level local dailies from the licensed electrical contractors of ELBO, Orissa. Wherever such licensed electrical contractors are not available or in the interest of speedy execution, Collector may entrust the work of execution to the concerned DISTCOM or OSIC or IDCO on turn key basis.



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(iii) Detailed Project Report (DPR) with cost estimates for electrification under 'Bijli Gram Jyoti' shall be prepared by the respective executing agency, which will be scrutinized by SE/ EE of DISTCOM of concerned District and approved by Collector of the District. Scrutiny of estimates and supervision of execution work shall be done by the concerned DISTCOM, for which they will be entitled to receive 6% of the estimated cost as 'supervision charge' from the executing agency, except when the Scheme is executed through the DISTCOM concerned itself.

(iv) The certified list of habitations / villages below 100 population (based on 2001 census) along with the relevant data shall be supplied by the concerned Collector/DISTCOM to the executing agency within 15 days of requisition. The certified list of BPL habitations shall be supplied by the respective DRDA to the executing agency.

(v) The list of habitations / villages below 100 population shall be placed before the District Electrical Committee (DEC) constituted below for approval and assigning priority both the purpose of electrification of village/habitation and Kutir Jyoti :

(vi) All statutory clearances / approvals / compliance required for construction / implementation of the project including right of way, forest clearance etc., shall be obtained by the executing agency with the help of SE/ EE of DISTCOM and Collector of the District concerned.



5. VERIFICATION

- (i) The quantity and quality of the work done by the executing agency will be verified by the Electrical Engineers of DISTCOM concerned not below the rank of Assistant Engineer.
- (ii) At least 25% of the BGJ works will be cross-checked by the concerned area Assistant Electrical Inspector of the office of EIC, Electricity-cum- PCEI, Orissa on sample basis. Conveyance for the sample inspection by the Assistant Electrical Inspector shall be provided by the concerned Implementing Agency.
- (iii) The electrification inspection and certification for village/ habitation electrification as well as 'Kutir Jyoti' shall be done by the concerned Electrical Inspector as per the procedure under the law.
- (iv) Certificate of Completion of electrification of habitation/ village shall be issued by the concerned Block /Gram Panchayat copies of which will be sent by the executing agency to the concerned MP/MLA/Zilla Parishad / DISTCOM, Collectorate and EIC, Electricity -cum-PCEI, Orissa for record.


6. Scheme Identification Mechanism

Sub-stations or Transformers Upgraded/ installed or PSC Poles installed and BPL households electrified under the Biju Gram Jyoti will be inscribed with the name of the scheme i.e. "Biju Gram Jyoti" and the year of electrification, in white paint, in the back ground of deep green paint.

7. Collectors shall maintain separate account for the funds placed under the Biju Gram Jyoti. Diversion of Biju Gram Jyoti funds for any other purpose shall not be allowed.




8. On successful completion of project, all the assets created under the BGJ shall be handed over by the executing agency to the respective DISTCOM for maintenance.
9. The villages /habitations taken up/ proposed for electrification and BPL house holds electrified or proposed to be electrified under RGGVY, Biju KBK or any other scheme shall not be included in the electricity plan of the Biju Gram Jyoti.
10. The EIC, Electricity-cum-PCEI, Orissa, Bhubaneswar will be the Nodal Agency for Implementation of the Biju Gram Jyoti Scheme.
11. The Scheme has been concurred by the Finance Department vide U.O.R.- No. 914 /MF dated 12.09.2007.
